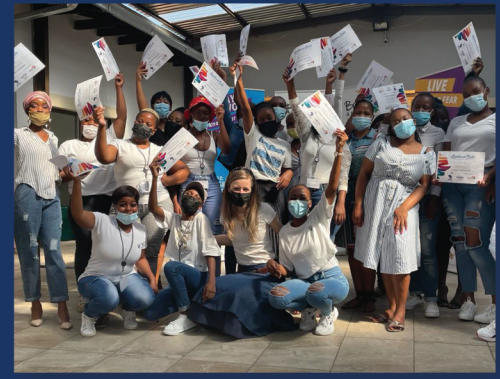

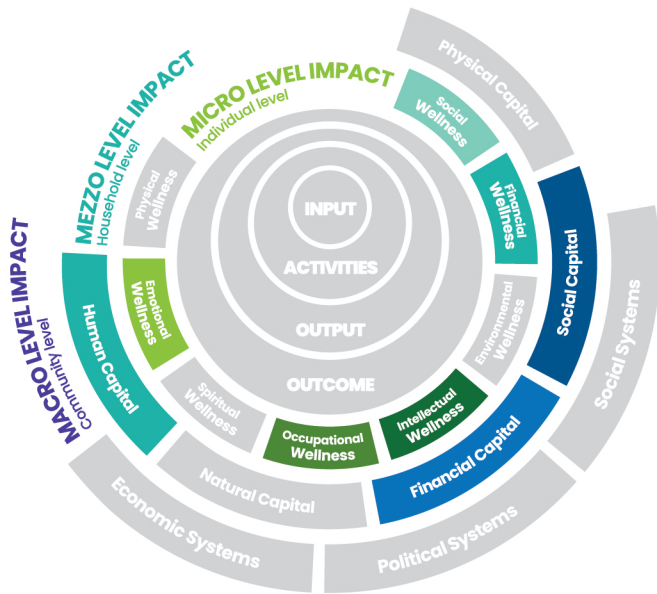
Programme Overview

The Economic Strengthening Livelihood Programme (ESLP GLO Full) focused on people, particularly youth, who are not currently employed or enrolled in educational programmes or training (NEET). Through the ESLP programme, the beneficiaries are empowered with the necessary skills and tools to find better livelihood opportunities and have a better chance at keeping those opportunities and making them successful.
