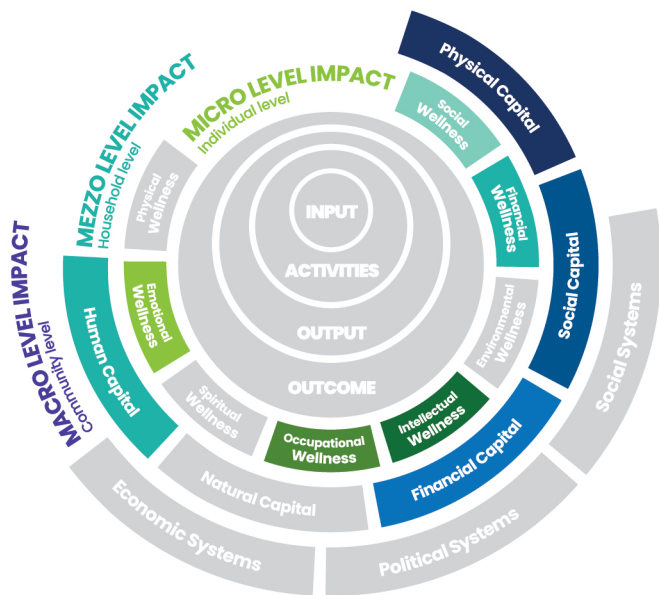
## Programme Overview

The Sex Workers Economic Empowerment (SWEE) Programme revolved around reducing participants' economic vulnerability and vulnerability to other social ills, such as HIV and AIDS. The main objective of the Sex Worker Economic Empowerment Programme was to empower sex workers to explore alternative livelihood opportunities by enabling them to acquire new skills. These new skills included training in financial literacy, work readiness, emerging leaders, and entrepreneurial skills. Furthermore, the programme aimed to refer sex workers to the partner organisation for further socio-economic support in pursuing alternative work opportunities, entrepreneurship or education.

Beulah Africa was appointed to implement the pilot programme in different locations, namely, Krugersdorp, Carletonville, Burgersfort, and Groblersdal.
